* Membership type:

Individual member - \$130 (full year) Individual membership is for an individual signing up for the VCC

Joint member - \$20 (full year) Joint Membership is for spouses and partners of a Member, or a dependent child of a Member up to twenty one (21) years of age, residing with that member, or temporarily residing away from that Member while attending an educational institution. Initial subscription for Joint members is \$20 inclusive of GST. Joint members do not receive their own copy of the club magazine 'Beaded Wheels', nor branch newsletters.

Note - you will need to enter the member number of the Individual (main) member that the joint member lives with if you know it. If you are joining both an Individual member and a Joint member, please complete this form for the Individual member, then another for the joint member.

Junior member - \$65 (full year) Junior Member – Any Member who is 21 or under, at 31st October this year, usually living away from parents (who may or may not be members), who pay 50% of the individual subscriptions. Initial subscription for Junior members is \$65 inclusive of GST. Junior members receive their own copy of the club magazine 'Beaded Wheels', and also branch newsletters.

Main and junior initial subscriptions are pro rated if the member joins part way through the subs year (1 November to 31 October), and the initial subs invoice will reflect this. For example if you join in August, you will be charged 125% of the initial subscription, 25% for the 3 months covering August to October, and the next full year November to October. If you join in Feb to April, you will be charged 75% of a full year subscription.

* Suppress Member Data

means that when list of members are sent to branches, for use by members, your member record will be suppressed and not included in such lists. Some branches will not include suppressed members in rally results reported in their newsletter.

* Suppress Vehicle Data

means this vehicle's details will be suppressed when the club distributes name and address and vehicle lists to branches, except branch secretaries who have access to all branch member's information.

* Body Style

means one of - Tourer, Station Wagon, Sedan/Saloon, Motorcycle, Sports/Racing, Sports, Roadster, Racing Car, Coupe, Hatchback, Liftback, Power Cycle, Military vehicle, Cycle Car, Commercial vehicle.

* Condition

means one of – Authentic Reproduction Vehicle, Original vehicle (Roadworthy and Licensed), Parts Only/Incomplete, Restored vehicle (Roadworthy/Licensed), in Storage, Undergoing restoration.

- A **Vehicle Identification Card (VIC)** which demonstrates to members, vehicle inspection authorities and the public at large that the vehicle is correctly described, and has the correct major components (engine, chassis etc.) for that make, model and year.
- A **Lighting Endorsement** for vehicles with period lighting that no longer meet modern standards, and allows the vehicles to be used on NZ roads.
- Reduced vehicle registration fee for older vehicles negotiated on behalf of members.
- Representation and/or collaboration with the Federation of Motoring Clubs, Low Volume Vehicle Technical Association and Motorsport New Zealand.
- Representation as the sole New Zealand delegate to the Fédération Internationale des Véhicules Anciens (FIVA) which is a world-wide organisation advocating on behalf of its two million members.
